The Joy and Burden of Care Giving: Compassion Fatigue and Self-Care

Child Life Specialists chose to work with infants, children, youth and families in various settings to protect the emotional wellbeing of children facing severe stressors and crises—including grief, death and bereavement. These caregivers are not invulnerable to the suffering they must bear witness to daily. It is their compassion that propels them to be involved and assist families in their most difficult hours. However, walking in trauma impacts a caregiver's views about life, themselves, their loved ones, and ultimately—the reasons they put themselves on the front line.

This session is to empower the Child Life Specialist to re-balance their life and increase their resilience so that they can remain hardy doing the work they embrace so passionately. It will educate about the signs and symptoms of CF and outline strategies to mitigate the effects of CF while retaining a sense of confidence and connectedness to the crisis work.
